

Dear parents and carers,

31st January 2025

Good afternoon, I have a few key things to talk about in today's newsletter and so I will use subheadings to help you find the information easily: - Please pay particular attention to my first item - I have received a lot of communication about irresponsible and dangerous parking over the past couple of weeks, including from: parents; local residents; the Police and Preet Gill MP. It has resulted in photos being taken, fines issued and a stronger Police Presence: -

Police warning for parents in regards to parking

Staff in school are working closely with the Police to tackle unsafe driving, unsafe stopping and unsafe parking outside of school. We have been given an allocated police officer, who we will be reporting directly to. PC Anthony Henry, badge no 30847, will be patrolling Vivian Road frequently and wearing his camera. He is working with residents in Vivian Close; he has spoken with some of our families and recorded any incidences of unsafe stopping and parking, issuing fines.

PC Anthony Henry's presence is as a result of a series of warnings that have been ignored; and staff (and parents and residents), who have been verbally abused when tackling this problem. At school, we know that most parents drive and park safely. But, I have instructed staff to challenge any parking that is unsafe. I myself will be doing regular observations. It is important that you do not show aggression to staff who ask you to park and drive safely, we are trying to keep your children safe. Aggression aimed towards staff, will not be tolerated in any way.

We have also had communication from MP Preet Gill after a complaint from a resident. I have been written to with the license plates of offenders to speak to. This is a very difficult task. Key issues seem to be parents parking over the dropped kerbs, parking in the private parking bays, blocking driveways, and then being verbally abusive when asked to move - this must stop. Parents are not meant to park on single yellow lines or zig zags; or double park; or drop their children off in the middle of the road. This is incredibly dangerous. Please park safely - using Harborne cricket club, or Waitrose car park and walk the remainder of the way to school.

PC Henry praised the response many of our parents have shown by reporting incidences. He has asked me to remind you to continue to take photos and report unsafe driving, parking and stopping at 'operation snap'. so that together we will tackle the few who continue to make our environment unsafe for our children.

Year of the Jubilee - Pilgrims of Hope

On Friday 24th January, we had a fabulous Jubilee launch day in school, joining in with all Catholic Schools in the Diocese to learn more about what Catholics are expected to do during this special year. Archbishop Longley has asked all of us to focus on prayer, social action and fundraising in this year, so that we can help those who are poor and vulnerable, and those who need our help the most. All children have been given a badge to wear. The badge is for the children to wear throughout the entire school year to show that they strive to be pilgrims of hope.

Archbishop Visit

Archbishop Longley visited the parish of St. Mary's last weekend. It was such a wonderful celebration, where so many of St. Mary's community were present. Many of the staff and children were at the 9:30am family Mass and the choir sang beautifully. Following the Mass, families were welcomed in to school to have tea and cake with His Grace in our school hall. His Grace and Fr. Hilary were very complimentary of all the work that is going on in the Parish, and in the school to nurture the faith and behaviours of the children. I definitely had a proud Headteacher moment. Proud of the staff who go above and beyond; proud of the children; and proud of the special relationship that we have with the Church and priests. Long may this way of working continue.
