We began our week with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the children (and staff) in Years 3-6 had the opportunity to go to Confession., in order to say sorry for the times that we make mistakes and to prepare our hearts for Jesus this Easter. Our Reception parents have come in to school to work alongside their children in the classrooms and hopefully you picked up some tips of how you can further support your children with their writing at home. Today we are beginning to prepare for Holy Week - our Reception and KSI classes led us in a joyous Palm Sunday collective worship, where we waved palms and thought about Jesus' triumphal entry in to Jerusalem. Next week, the children will follow the Holy Week journey of the Last Supper (Y3), Garden of Gethsemane (Y4), Good Friday (Y5) and Stations of the Cross (Y6). This year, the collective worship will be for the children only. But parents are welcome to join us in the Church on Good Friday at 12pm for the Stations of the Cross.


Year 6 Mass - 5th Week of Lent

Year 2 news: -


Year 2 have been hard at work in their Computing lessons creating PowerPoints about Bengal Tigers







Year 3 news: -








St. Mary's Charity Work for Lent...

Standard Assessment Tests (SAT's)

Please note the following:

- Year 6 SATs take place Monday 9th May Thursday 12th May
- Year 2 SATs take place during the month of May
- Year 4 Times Tables Check from 6th June (3 week period)
- Year 1 Phonics Screen Check takes place Week Beginning from 6th June (3 week period)



Please do not book holidays for any of the above dates. Further details will be given out nearer the time.

Swimming lessons will begin on Wednesday 4th May for all of the children in Year 2. Swimming lessons are a compulsory part of the PE curriculum and therefore participation is obligatory. If your child is unable to participate for a medical reason then a doctor's note must be provided.

The session: Wednesdays - 1:00 - 1:30 (leave school at 12:30; leave baths at 2:00)

What to wear:

To walk to and from swimming, pupils are expected to wear plain navy or black tracksuit bottoms, yellow/gold t-shirt emblazoned with the school logo, blue school jumper or cardigan emblazoned with the school logo and black trainers. Velcro fastenings are very helpful and recommended for quick changing!



In the water, girls should wear a one-piece swimsuit (bikinis are not permitted) and boys should wear swimming trunks (not baggy 'board shorts'). All children should wear a swim hat, with any pupils with long hair ensuring that their hair is tied up. Googles are optional. Swim socks should be worn on the feet if a pupil has a verruea or a wart.
