
No Mass next week






Heathcote House

Year I news: -


Year 1 have been using the language 'heavier' and 'lighter' to compare objects in the classroom.








Year 2 news: Year 2 have been learning about

Year 3 have been identifying the key features of a balanced argument in English lessons.










Year 4 news: -






Reception Easter Bonnet parade - Tuesday 26th March 2:00pm

Do not book holidays during term time


