We will not tolerate anybody being spoken to aggressively or threatened as a result of trying to keep our school community safe - I will report any aggressive behaviour to the Police and perpetrators will receive a formal ban from the school site. Next week, we will be celebrating what makes us unique with our inter-faith and anti-bullying week. This is such an important week for us in school, as we continue our them of 'dignity' and how we should treat everybody with love

Year I have been practising the poem "Poppies for Remembrance" by Moira Andrew in preparation for the Poetry Recital.













Year 2 have been reading the fantastic rhyming story of "Peace Lily" by Hilary Robinson and they prepared an extract ready for the Poetry Recital.




#### Reception news: -

The children performed the poem in different groups!








Year 2 news: -


