I would like to share with you our fantastic response from parents' evening. - 93% of parents strongly agree or agree that the school is a supportive and joyful community
- 95% of parents strongly agree or agree that staff at the school are positive role models
- 91% of parents strongly agree or agree that the school works well with the local parish
- 94% of parents strongly agree or agree that they understand the school's Catholic mission
- 91% of parents strongly agree or agree that the school supports them in their role as educators of their child
- 96% of parents strongly agree or agree that their child enjoys learning in RE lessons
- 84% of parents strongly agree or agree that they know how their child is doing in RE
- 95% of parents strongly agree or agree that the school supports their child's spiritual and moral development

Thank you to our 125 parents who took the time to fill out the survey. When we had lower percentage numbers, it was because parents often selected neutral... I am not sure if this is because you're not sure or don't really have an opinion on the statement – but in the upcoming weeks, I will give more information about what we are doing and invite you to give your opinion on how we can be even better.

Our final question was: - Is there anything else you would like to tell us about the Catholic Life and mission, religious education, or prayer at this school?




Prayer




