Year 4 news: – Year 4 learnt how to outwit an opponent in Badminton this week.




Year 5 news: -






Even the youngest children' in our school plan, lead and participate in Collective Worship. This week, Reception reflected upon how we know Jesus is all around us in how we treat others.

We are closed for the bank holiday on Monday 6th May.




Standard Assessment Tests (SATs)
