As we have journeyed this week through the first week of Advent, we have been preparing our hearts and minds for the nativity. At the heart of our preparations is prayer and the staff and children are leading us in prayer and liturgy daily, as we walk with the Holy Family, towards Jesus' birth.

This Sunday, we enter the second week of Advent and we light our 'Bethlehem' candle representing faith. Next week, the children will be reminded of Mary and Joseph's trip to Bethlehem as we explore deeper our own faith moving towards Christmas. On the second page of this newsletter, I include a prayer focus that you can do with your family at home, with a task that can be completed too. If your child does this task, please bring it in for our Advent displays in school.

We have two weeks left in school with so much going on. I have included all important information within this newsletter. Thank you to our PTA for supporting our Christmas preparations at this time and helping with our fundraising. We had a really big turn out for the Christmas discos this week.

If you are attending the KSI nativity or LKS2 nativity, please be aware that there is limited space in the hall. We are not 'ticketing' the events, but we only have space for 2 adults per child in the hall. There will also not be space for pushchairs and prams, so please try not to bring these, as they will have to be left outside of the hall.

A gentle reminder that if your child has a school meal, please remember to check School Gateway regularly and to keep outstanding balances down to a reasonable level. We now have quite a few parents owing more than £100. We appreciate that this may be a more difficult time of year to clear this, so we will send reminders out in the new year. If you have any questions regarding your child's school meals account, please contact the office.

We have an early finish when we break up on Friday 20th December and staff are keen to leave on time to begin their Christmas break. Please check the times for pick up in the dates section of this newsletter. Any children who are late being collected are put in to Kidz.comm after school provision, where there is a charge. Thank you for your support and I wish you a very happy weekend.


This week's Gospel and Prayer

Our Year 5 children really enjoyed the Christmaths challenge at Bishop Challoner School today and represented our school really well.






Advert preparation... in school



Year I have written their Advent promises for how to prepare their hearts this Advent.










The children in Year 2 have created their own Advent wreaths to help them prepare for the birth of Jesus

Year 5 children have prepared their prayer tables with ways that they can prepare their hearts for Advent.









St. Catherine of Siena School

St Catherine's have asked our schools to support by collecting items for the Birmingham Christmas Shelter - they need: - toiletries, biscuits, crisps, cordial, clothing.

School Fund

Our School Fund is a vital source of income for our school.

It pays for the 'extras' such as Inspire workshops, curriculum resources, Christmas activities, theatre or performances as well as subsidising school trips.

These 'extras' are enjoyed by all year groups at St Mary's throughout the year.

Contribution to this fund is entirely voluntary and we are very grateful to those parents who regularly support the school in this way. However, in the last few years the amount of school fund received has dropped quite significantly. There are probably many reasons for this, but perhaps the most obvious is remembering to send in a donation every year, half term or term.

We understand that some families may find donating to us difficult, especially with the current cost of living crisis. With that in mind we have decided to alter the way our donations are done and hopefully make it easier to maintain.

Several parents make their contribution by standing order and we are very grateful to them all.

As we have been accepted as a charity for tax purposes, we can claim the tax on donations to school fund by parents who are taxpayers if those parents sign a Gift Aid Declaration.

This means that for every pound you give we get an extra 25p from the Inland Revenue, helping your donation to go further.

Consequently, by setting up a standing order for say, £2 per month per child or £5 per month per family for parents with multiple siblings who attend St Mary's, you will guarantee the school a monthly income on which we can reclaim tax.

Please consider this option seriously. If you feel unable to sign up to a monthly payment, why not pay a one-off payment of £20 per child per year or £50 per family per year, again with a Gift Aid declaration.

A Gift Aid declaration and standing order form has been emailed out to our families. If you wish to gift aid your donations then please complete and return these to school at your earliest convenience.

Do not book holidays during term time
