Year 1 travelled back in time to the Victorian era. They learned about different toys from the past and present and who they might belong to, using Now Press Play.











Year 2 news: -





Summary of Child Protection Information for Visitors and Volunteers

Our school is committed to the highest standards in protecting and safeguarding the children entrusted to our care.

Our school will support all children by:

- · Promoting a caring, safe and positive environment
- Encouraging self-esteem and self-assertiveness
- · Effectively tackling bullying and harassment

We recognise that some children may be the victims of neglect, physical, sexual or emotional abuse. Staff working with children are well placed to identify such abuse.

At our school in order to protect our children, we aim to:

- · Create an atmosphere where all our children feel secure, valued and listened to
- · Recognise signs and symptoms of abuse
- · Respond quickly, appropriately and effectively to cases of suspected abuse

Do not book holidays during term time

This is a reminder that holidays during term time are unauthorised. If you intend to take your child out of school during term time, we ask that you complete a holiday request form at least 2 weeks prior to the leave date where possible. Parents may be fined by the Local Authority for taking unauthorised leave of absence. Children need to be in school every day so please ensure holidays are only booked during school holiday time.

Good attendance, continues to be a school and government priority.

Remember below 95% is a concern and below 90% is classed as persistent absence. If you have any problems with regards to getting your child to school or you are struggling to improve your child's attendance, please speak to Mrs. Yorke or Mrs. Davis.
