

I wish you all a very pleasant weekend and we will see you on Monday. God bless,



The Spiritual Council have created a prayer area in school for children to offer their prayers for health and healing for Pope Francis.



World Down Syndrome Day is a global awareness day officially observed by the United Nations since 2012. The date, 21st March (i.e. the 3rd month of the year), was chosen to reflect the fact that people with Down Syndrome have 3 copies of chromosome number 21.

**Lots of socks!** To observe the Down Syndrome campaign, the children wore bright, bold, and even mismatched socks. The brighter and crazier - the better! Socks were chosen as the basis of this international campaign because chromosomes are thought to look a little bit like pairs of socks.



#### Do not book holidays during term time
