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


# Whole school Mass for Epiphany - 5.1.22

Year 1 are already enjoying their gymnastics lessons with the Bishop Challoner Coach








Year 2 news: Year 2 have been learning all about India.

Your information / car registration may be passed on to the police city council, if you continue to park illegally. Please put the safety of our children and community first when parking.


### SATs Week for Year 6

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# Reading diaries

Please remember to sign the reading diary for your child when you have read with them at home. Children learn to read best when they read to an adult every day, who can support them with intonation, pronunciation, new words and meaning. Children have daily reading lessons in school, but make most progress when they read at home too.

# PE times / Swimming

PE times for many of the classes have changed for this term. Please make sure that you send children in **correct** PE uniform on the days that they have their PE lesson. See timetable below.

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On a Friday, **Year 4F** and **Year 4L** to come in to school wearing normal school uniform, but to remember their swimming kits.



### Correct Uniform

The children should now be wearing their <u>winter uniform</u> i.e. shirts/blouses and **ties**.

We also ask that children come to school in their winter PE kit on the days that they have PE. Again children should be in uniform for PE which is black/blue plain jogging bottoms (not patterned / not another colour), yellow t-shirt, school jumper and black trainers.

# Covid Update

In accordance with our Covid risk assessment and current government guidance, please do not send your child in to school if they have symptoms of Covid. The three key symptoms of Covid are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to taste or smell

Any body who shows 1 of the above symptoms needs to isolate immediately and follow government advice regarding taking a PCR test.

The omicron variant has been noted to present sometimes as more like a cold, therefore if your child feels unwell with cold-like symptoms, a lateral flow test is recommended before sending your child in to school.

If your child tests positive for Covid, please let school know as soon as possible and we will provide work on e-schools (if your child feels well enough to complete it).

If your child is a close contact of somebody with Covid or living in a household with somebody who has Covid, please get your child tested to ensure that they are negative, before sending them in to school.

As a school, we are having isolated cases of Covid at the moment. Miss Price will not write to parents following <u>every</u> instance of Covid. However, the school risk assessment and Covid Outbreak plan (which is on the school website) is be followed and Miss Price will write to parents should there be more than one case in a class to notify that there are cases in the class. This will not necessarily mean that your child has been a close contact, but on receiving the letter, you may wish to give your child a lateral flow test.

If we believe your child has been a close contact of a positive case, school will contact you directly.

Guidance continuously changes, so please phone the office to ask if you are unsure. Thank you.
