Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to all of our children and a particular welcome to our new Reception children and their families, who have joined our St. Mary's family. I hope that you all had a wonderful Summer break and have settled in to routines again, as we begin the new school year. For our new (and returning families), I would like to highlight the importance of checking our school website for important information that you may require such as: term dates, policies, previous newsletters, school menus, uniform, admissions and curriculum. We attempt to keep the website up to date so that you have this information to hand, so please do check the website as your first point of call. Also, please follow our X account https://x.com/StMaryB17 as we regularly update this with evidence of our curriculum, and key information that you may need to know.

Over the holidays, our e-schools platform has stopped working. It is my intention not to renew e-schools having taken on board feedback from parents about reducing our communication channels, so that we instead use one platform efficiently for communication. This will take a little time to sort out, so please bare with us. Without e-schools, it does mean that parents will not be able to directly message the teacher. Please pass on any information to the SLT member on the gate each morning, or you can make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher. Alternatively, any messages should come through our school office on 0121 464 2141 or email enquiry@stmaryrc.bham.sch.uk.

With regards to homework, we are going to trial a half-termly Year group newsletter at the start of every half-term which will provide key information for your child's year group such as spellings for the half-term, key dates, curriculum and learning support. This will be emailed to you on the first Monday of the half-term.

Any other updates I will inform you of in the Friday newsletter, which will be emailed out to you and can also be found on our X page and on the website. Please ensure that we have your most up to date phone numbers and email addresses so that you do not miss out on any important communication from school.

Within this newsletter, I include all the dates that are in the diary for the first half of the Autumn term - please note that sometimes dates do change, but we will give advanced notice if this happens. Dates can always be found on the penultimate page of the newsletter. I have also confirmed PE days. On PE days, children can come in to school wearing PE uniform - please note that we have a <u>uniform for PE</u>, which children must wear. Please also note that we do have daily uniform checks in school and parents are contacted if uniform is not correct - this does include hairstyles and the wearing of jewellery. If you need support with uniform, please speak to a member of SLT. We need help with fundraising this year - every penny counts towards providing the best enrichment for your children. Please support us by signing up to school fund, joining the Asda cashpot for schools and supporting our PTA in the events they hold. 
Reflecting on this week's Gospel message we learn that:

- True holiness comes from the love that we share with others



General school consent

As part of our continuing efforts to enrich the curriculum and serve our community, we arrange trips and activities off the school site. We have therefore prepared a General School Consent for this purpose i.e..: so you do not have to complete multiple consent forms throughout the year. This is not intended to replace consent forms for class trips or residentials but rather trips and activities in our local area e.g.: Harborne Library, a local care home or park. A link will be sent to you by email and we would be grateful if a form could be completed for each child.

St Mary's Catholic Primary School General School Consent 2024

From time to time, the school organises additional trips and activities to enrich your child's learning or to fulfil our responsibilities to our community in carrying out our Mission, and to ensure the safety and security of your child, we require your consent for your child to participate.

This form represents a General School Consent (GSC) which will endure for the duration of their time at St Mary's Catholic Primary School, unless withdrawn in writing.

The trips and activities covered by this GSC include any visit within the UK that is not residential and that does not require transport e.g.: trips to Harborne Library, a local park or care home for carol singing etc.

The school will still send you information about each trip and activity before it takes place. Please note, this information may be communicated verbally or electronically by email.

The trips and activities covered by this GSC will only take place with express permission from the Head Teacher (or whomever deputises).

All trips and activities covered by this GSC will adhere to statutory or recommended requirements for supervision.

If your child is involved in any other trips or activities not covered by this GSC e.g.: a residential trip or a trip that requires transport, you will receive further information and additional consent will be required.

You must complete a separate GSC for each of your children at the school.

As you will be aware, there is currently a consultation underway on the future of Birmingham libraries which includes Harborne Library. As a school, we visit weekly and many of our families visit the Library on weekends. There is a public consultation at Harborne Library scheduled on 24.09.24 ahead of the end of the final consultation period on 27.09.24.

As it stands, the preferred option for Birmingham City Council is the closure of the existing Harborne Library building, with the Library being relocated to another (unspecified) building open for only 2 or 3 days a week. This would be devastating to St Mary's and the wider community.

We will be voicing our concerns to the Council and would welcome your support as the parent body also. More information will follow next week.

Please see the information below regarding the days each class will have their PE lesson. On PE days - the children come in <u>wearing their PE uniform</u>.

Please ensure that any jewellery is taken off for PE days for your child's (and others) safety. Year 6 will need their swimming kit on a Thursday ready for their swimming lessons.

School Fund

Our School Fund is a vital source of income for our school.

It pays for the 'extras' such as Inspire workshops, curriculum resources, Christmas activities, theatre or performances as well as subsidising school trips. These 'extras' are enjoyed by all year groups at St Mary's throughout the year.

Contribution to this fund is entirely voluntary and we are very grateful to those parents who regularly support the school in this way. However, in the last few years the amount of school fund received has dropped quite significantly. There are probably many reasons for this, but perhaps the most obvious is remembering to send in a donation every year, half term or term.

We understand that some families may find donating to us difficult, especially with the current cost of living crisis. With that in mind we have decided to alter the way our donations are done and hopefully make it easier to maintain.

Several parents make their contribution by standing order and we are very grateful to them all.

As we have been accepted as a charity for tax purposes, we can claim the tax on donations to school fund by parents who are taxpayers if those parents sign a Gift Aid Declaration. This means that for every pound you give we get an extra 25p from the Inland Revenue, helping your donation to go further.

Consequently, by setting up a standing order for say, £2 per month per child or £5 per month per family for parents with multiple siblings who attend St Mary's, you will guarantee the school a monthly income on which we can reclaim tax.

Please consider this option seriously. If you feel unable to sign up to a monthly payment, why not pay a one-off payment of £20 per child per year or £50 per family per year, again with a Gift Aid declaration.

A Gift Aid declaration and standing order form has been emailed out to our families. If you wish to gift aid your donations then please complete and return these to school at your earliest convenience.

End of day

Please take note of the end of day timings and where you need to stand to collect your children.

At 3:10pm, Reception parents (once children are in fu time) are to walk down the drive on the left hand side (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:15pm, Year 1 and Year 2 parents are to walk down the drive on the **right** hand side (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:20pm, siblings will be released to parents, who will walk down on the **right** hand side (as shown by the blue arrows). Siblings is for when <u>your children are in</u> <u>different key stages</u> i.e. one child in KS1 and one child in KS2. If your child is in the same key stage, they will come out with their class. Siblings will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 3 and Year 4 parents are to walk down the drive on the **left** hand side (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 5 and Year 6 parents are to walk down the drive on the **right** hand side (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.



Please note: -The school has a walking home policy that states that children should be picked up by the parents. We encourage children to only walk home by themselves in the Summer term of Year 6.



Labelling of clothing with child's name and class name Please label all belongings for your child (including lunch boxes / water bottles / school bags / clothing...) Items that are labelled are returned to your child's classroom when they are left somewhere else in school. Items that are not labelled are placed in the parent shelter. To ensure that no items are lost, label everything.

Jewellery



To ensure the safety of all children, we will only allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE. On PE days we are asking that children do not wear any jewellery, so that it is not lost if they are asked to remove it for physical lessons. Thank you for supporting us with this, your child's safety is at the forefront of our uniform decisions.

Healthy Snacks

Please may we remind all parents that only healthy snacks are permitted in school
your child may have a piece of fruit at break time. Do not send your child in with crisps, sweets or chocolate as they will not be able to consume this on site.
Please also be aware that we do not allow nuts, in order to reduce the chance of children with allergies from having a reaction.

Summary of Child Protection Information for Visitors and Volunteers

Our school is committed to the highest standards in protecting and safeguarding the children entrusted to our care.

Our school will support all children by:

We recognise that some children may be the victims of neglect, physical, sexual or emotional abuse. Staff working with children are well placed to identify such abuse.

At our school in order to protect our children, we aim to:

- Create an atmosphere where all our children feel secure, valued and listened to
- Recognise signs and symptoms of abuse
- Respond quickly, appropriately and effectively to cases of suspected abuse



Do not book holidays during term time

This is a reminder that holidays during term time are unauthorised. If you intend to take your child out of school during term time, we ask that you complete a holiday request form at least 2 weeks prior to the leave date where possible. Parents may be fined by the Local Authority for taking unauthorised leave of absence. Children need to be in school every day so please ensure holidays are only booked during school holiday time.

Good attendance, continues to be a school and government priority. Good attendance is 96% and above Remember below 95% is a concern and below 90% is classed as persistent absence. If you have any problems with regards to getting your child to school or you are struggling to improve your child's attendance, please speak to Mrs. Yorke or Mrs. Davis.
