






Our next Mass - Year 2 Mass - Votive Mass for St. Matthew

Perpetual Pilgrims

Pilgrimage of Hope - A Joyful Encounter at St. Mary's

As part of the Catholic Church's preparations for the 2025 Jubilee Year, Pope Francis called us to become "Pilgrims of Hope." In response, a nationwide walking pilgrimage took has taken place across England and Wales, reviving the ancient tradition of pilgrimage as a sacred journey of prayer, reflection, and community.


There are four principal pilgrimage routes—known as the "Ways"—originating from the Cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich, and Southwark (London). Each route dedicated to one of the Gospel writers: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Pilgrims walking the Matthew Way, from Cardiff to Nottingham, passed through St. Mary's Parish this past Sunday, and we were honoured to welcome them into our community.

A special Mass was celebrated in their presence, and our school choir sang beautifully to mark the occasion. It was a privilege to meet the small group of "perpetual pilgrims" who were walking the full 169-mile journey, and to share in this moment of spiritual unity and joy.

We extend heartfelt thanks to all the children, staff, and families who contributed to this celebration. Your warmth and hospitality truly embodied the spirit of hope and welcome that this pilgrimage represents.



School Fund

Our School Fund is a vital source of income for our school.

It pays for the 'extras' such as Inspire workshops, curriculum resources, Christmas activities, theatre or performances as well as subsidising school trips.

These 'extras' are enjoyed by all year groups at St Mary's throughout the year.

Contribution to this fund is entirely voluntary and we are very grateful to those parents who regularly support the school in this way. However, in the last few years the amount of school fund received has dropped quite significantly. There are probably many reasons for this, but perhaps the most obvious is remembering to send in a donation every year, half term or term.

Several parents make their contribution by standing order and we are very grateful to them all. As we have been accepted as a charity for tax purposes, we can claim the tax on donations to school fund by parents who are taxpayers if those parents sign a Gift Aid Declaration. This means that for every pound you give we get an extra 28p from the Inland Revenue, helping your donation to go further. Consequently, by setting up a standing order for say, £2 per month per family, you will guarantee the school a monthly income on which we can reclaim tax and be able to forget your hunt for change for your usual donation.

Please consider this option seriously. If you feel unable to sign up to a monthly payment, why not pay £20 per year by cash, again with a Gift Aid declaration.

All we ask in this instance is that you include your donation and declaration in an envelope clearly marked with the name of your child and the value of your donation.

This is an essential bookkeeping requirement of the Inland Revenue.

A Gift Aid declaration and a standing order form, have been emailed to you alongside today's newsletter. Please complete and return them to school. Or you can come in to school for a hard copy if your prefer.



Coats

As the weather is changeable now, please ensure that your child comes to school with their waterproof coats.



Jewellery

To ensure the safety of all children, we will only allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE. On PE days we are asking that children do not wear any jewellery, so that it is not lost if they are asked to remove it for physical lessons. Thank you for supporting us with this, your child's safety is at the forefront of our uniform decisions.

End of day

Please take note of the end of day timings and where you need to stand to collect your children.

At 3:10pm, Reception parents are to gather on the left hand side in green zone (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.


At 3:15pm, Year 1 and Year 2 parents are to walk down the drive on the **right** hand side and gather in red zone (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:20pm, siblings will be released to parents, who will walk down on the **right** hand side and gather in blue zone (as shown by the blue arrows). Siblings is for whe **your children are in different key stages** i.e. one child in KS1 and one child in KS2. If your child is in the same key stage, they will come out with their class. Siblings will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 3 and Year 4 parents are to walk down the drive on the **left** hand side and gather in green zone (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 5 and Year 6 parents are to walk down the drive on the **right** hand side and gather in red zone (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

END OF DAY COLLECTION POINTS AND TIMES -



Please note: -

The school has a walking home policy that states that children

should be picked up by the parents.

We encourage children to only walk home by themselves in the Summer term of Year 6.

Please stay behind the 'invisible line', in your zones, at dismissal so that staff can safely hand over children and maintain privacy for any conversations you need to have with teachers. Children must not run or scoot around the car park—it's not safe and parents please do not lean on staff cars as they get scratched.

Healthy Snacks

Please may we remind all parents that only healthy snacks are permitted in school – your child may have a piece of fruit at break time. Do not send your child in with crisps, sweets or chocolate as they will not be able to consume this on site. Please also be aware that we do not allow nuts, in order to reduce the chance of children with allergies from having a reaction.



Parking

We ask for everyone's commitment to safe driving and parking around school.

Please do not: -

- · stop or park on double yellow lines,
- stop in the middle of the road,
- stop or park on the zig zag lines outside of school
- block the school entrance,
- obstruct dropped kerbs meant for pushchairs,
- obstruct side roads such as Vivian Close.



Parking opposite the school is particularly dangerous for families crossing the road.

We work closely with the Council and Police, and fines may be issued. Any person of the community can photograph inconsiderate or dangerous parking and report...

Labelling of clothing with child's name and class name

You can claim any items needed from the parent shelter. To ensure that no items are lost, label everything with child's name and class.

Do not book holidays during term time
