We will be studying the following units in our RE lessons: -

Lent

In this unit the children will explore some of the customs and practices associated with the celebration of the Season of Lent. Through the life and teaching of Christ they will learn about prayer, fasting and almsgiving and the forgiveness that God offers to those who believe in him.

Holy Week

This unit provides the children with an opportunity to develop their knowledge and understanding of the story of Christ's passion and death. They will be given opportunities to reflect upon the circumstances and reasons for his death.

Curriculum Map - Spring 2

These are the topics that your child will be studying in Spring 2 -

Marvelous middle:

Visitor from St Basil's coming in to school to talk to the children about her role and what happens at a homeless shelter. Items collected in the trolley will then be taken back to St Basil's for distribution.

Science – Electricity

Children will be learning about electricity and constructing their own simple series circuits and naming the constituent parts.

Children will learn a new song, singing in time and tune, identify and play a repeated pattern on a tuned instrument, create and notate a musical motif, transpose it with changes in pitch and rhythm, and perform combined versions as a group.

Directional Language TBC The Family and counting to 50 Children will explore French language and culture through our unit on 'la famille.' They'll learn possessives like 'mon,' 'ma,' and 'mes' (my) for family members, as well as counting to 50. Engaging questions like 'Comment s'appelle ton/ta...' (What is the name of your...) and 'II/Elle s'appelle...' (He/She is called...) will encourage active participation.

Substantive Knowledge: Children will learn about the locations and geographical regions of Brazil and the UK. 
