
starting promptly at 9:15am. Year 3 children will be leading our Mass and Year 4 children will attend too. All parents are welcome to attend.

Reception class found rhyming words to describe Stick Man.




IF Feast day of St. Francis of Assisi - 4th October






Netball competition - 12.10.22



Please make sure that we have the correct contact details for any adults that you wish to pick up your child. School can not release your child to somebody who is not on the contact list.

We legally need two contacts for each child.

If you would like somebody to pick up your child that is not you - please make sure that you provide school with contact details of who is picking up your child.

Do not book holidays during term time

This is a reminder that holidays during term time are unauthorised. If you intend to take your child out of school during term time, we ask that you complete a holiday request form at least 2 weeks prior to the leave date where possible. Parents may be fined by the Local Authority for taking unauthorised leave of absence. Children need to be in school every day so please ensure holidays are only booked during school holiday time.
