Year 4 have been debating about the use of plastic and whether plastic bags should be used or not.








Year 5 news: Year 5 have been working very hard on their Christmaths problems.









Year 6 news: Year 6 have completed Persuasive Speeches on 'Who is the most important character in the Christmas story?' They were very persuasive!

Your information / car registration may be passed on to the police / city council, if you continue to park illegally. Please put the safety of our children and community first when parking.


SATs Week for Year 6

When should my child self-isolate or miss school?



- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PRC test), <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PRC test.

YES

 If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.

 - NO
- All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.
- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.
