13th May - Feast of Our Lady of Fatima

Tomorrow, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Fatima – it would be lovely if all the children in the Fatima classes (at least) could say one decade of the Rosary to end this pandemic.

Schools Opening:

You will be aware that the government has issued new guidance and that schools are likely to re-open to some children from 1st June. Until we have much more information and agreement that this is safe for children and staff, we will be cautious in our response. We will, however, keep you fully informed via our Twitter account and website. When plans have been formalised, you will be written to in order to explain the new routines to maintain social distancing at all times.

When/ if we do return (the government is clear that infection rates must remain low over the next three week period to permit schools to re-open), we respectfully ask that if you have not kept to the government lockdown guidance that you do NOT send your child into school. For example, if you have allowed others from outside of your household to visit your home or you have met up with people outside of your immediate family and not from within your own household.

The government guidance is to 'stay alert' to avoid infectious virus spread when present restrictions are eased. Deviating from social distancing, for example, will ultimately jeopardise the safety and security of the children and staff who will be in school. The government's latest guidance is based largely on TRUST until a systematic means of alerting potential infection is in place. We rely on our parents and staff to be trustworthy in this crucial way - for the safety of all.

We also ask that if your child or any members of your household display any suspected Covid-19 symptoms whatsoever (i.e. cough, high temperature, lethargy) that you keep to the two week self-isolation procedure that is currently in place.

<u>Washing Hands!</u> It is crucial that, as we prepare to return to school in some form, that the children are really well trained in hand washing – 20 seconds with soap, in between fingers etc. If it is the single most important thing to do to protect ourselves (as we have been told), then it is the single most important preparation/training you can provide to your child in order to help us all stay safe when we return.




