


WREATH MAKING WORKSHOP

The children had a marvellous time at our Jack and the Beanstalk pantomime yesterday.






Supporting our local Birmingham children this Christmas

We are accepting toys - new and unwrapped - and our final collection time is Wednesday 15th December.


Thank you for those who have donated so far.

Year 3 news: -


Year 3 have created their own Advent calendars based on the Walk with Me calendars from our prayer bags




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Year 4 news: -

Correct Uniform

The children should now be wearing their <u>winter uniform</u> i.e. shirts/blouses and ties.

We also ask that children come to school in their winter PE kit on the days that they have PE. Again children should be in uniform for PE which is black/blue plain jogging bottoms (not patterned / not another colour), yellow t-shirt, school jumper and black trainers.

To **ensure the safety of all children**, we will <u>only</u> allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE.

On PE days we are asking that children do not wear any jewellery, so that it is not lost if they are asked to remove it for physical lessons. Thank you for supporting us with this, your child's safety is at the forefront of our uniform decisions.


SATs Week for Year 6

When should my child self-isolate or miss school?



- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should stay at home and should book a PRC test), NOT a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PRC test.

YES

 If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.





NO

- All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.
- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.


