We have incredibly talented chess players at St. Mary's.



Year 2 have been asking 'big questions' to deepen their understanding, asking questions as King Charles II about the Great Fire of London.







Year 3 news: -



Reminders







A massive thank you to our parents who have worked with us to ensure that bags are within the dimensions needed to safely fit on the pegs designated to the children. As mentioned in previous newsletters, there is not room on the pegs for bulky bags / rucksacks.



Any children bringing bags / rucksacks that can not fit on the pegs will now be asked to leave them at the designated 'rucksack stop' where the lunch boxes are kept.

Correct Uniform

The children should now be wearing their winter uniform i.e. shirts/blouses and ties.

We also ask that children come to school in their winter PE kit on the days that they have PE. Again children should be in uniform for PE which is black/blue plain jogging bottoms (not patterned / not another colour), yellow t-shirt, school jumper and black trainers.



Jewellery



To ensure the safety of all children, we will only allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE.


On PE days we are asking that children do not wear any jewellery, so that it is not lost if they are asked to remove it for physical lessons. Thank you for supporting us with this, your child's safety is at the forefront of our uniform decisions. .

SATs Week for Year 6

Children in Year 6 will be taking their SATs Tests from Monday 9th to Friday 13th May 2022. All Year 6 children are required to be in school every day during SATs week.

Update your contact list

Contact details

Please make sure that we have the correct contact details for any adults that you wish to pick up your child. School can not release your child to somebody who is not on the contact list. If you would like somebody to pick up your child that is not you – please make sure that you provide school with contact details of who is picking up your child. We have received notification that unfortunately, a student from a local Primary school was involved in an incident this week, on the way into school, whereby a stranger pulled up next to him in a car and tried to grab him. We ask you to be extra vigilant at this time and to not leave your child without supervision at the start of the school day. The safety of your children is your responsibility until they are handed over to an adult in school.

Parking Safety







Parking enforcement officers are now circulating at the start and the end of the school day. Please be aware of this as they are issuing fines to those parked illegally.



NO STOPPING

The yellow lines outside of school have a 'NO STOPPING' rule between the hours of 8-9 am and 3-4 pm.

SAFE PARKING

There are places where you can park safely around the school area - please be considerate and keep our children safe by choosing one of these options.



When should my child self-isolate or miss school?



- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PRC test), <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PRC test.



- YES
- If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.



- All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.
- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.
