Year 2 led us in our Mass this week on the theme of prayer. Excellent signing and singing children.




Reception Mass (with Y6 buddies) - 4th Week of Lent

Year 4 learnt about the features of a playscript in English this week.





We have learnt so much in such a short amount of time.


Thank you Miss Heath for all of your hard work in organising our Careers Week.





Parents' Consultations

Booking is open for your Parent Consultation Evening Appointment

To book you will need to log on to eSchools using your parent log on details.

If you have forgotten your eSchools username and/or password, please contact the school office or send an email to forgottenpassword@stmaryrc.sch.uk

*Parents' evening appointments will be carried over two days -
Tuesday 19th March 2024 and Wednesday 20th March 2024.*

Our consultations will be hosted in the school hall.

After consultation with the teacher, your child's teacher will give you your child's books to look at.

You will then have time to look at the books in one of the Year 3 classrooms. In the other Year 3 classroom, we will have the book fair. Please do not take photos of the books - we have photos of children often stuck in and we do not have all the necessary permissions for the books to be photographed.

There will be a parent questionnaire to complete too.

After looking at your child's books, please leave them with the TA in the classroom and you can either go to your next appointment, or leave the school via the playground and main gate.

The appointment with the class teacher will last for ten minutes and timings will be strictly kept to. Please do not arrive any earlier than 5 minutes before your first appointment to help us keep numbers in the hall to a minimum and to allow for a timely well-organised evening.

Your children (those attending the school) will not be allowed to attend the appointment in the hall, if they are with you, we can look after them in the Year 2 classroom. If you need an interpreter, this should not be your child. It would be preferable if pre-school children, babies and older children do not attend the appointment so that you are able to focus on the consultation.

We are unable to look after pre-school children in our classrooms.

During parent consultations, key staff will be available for you if you have any concerns. Our SENDCo, Mrs Fowler, will be sat at a table in the hall. No prior appointment is needed, but if you would like to speak to Mrs Fowler about SEN, she will be available.

SLT (Mrs Yorke and Mrs Davis) are also present in their offices, should you need to discuss anything with them.



World Down Syndrome Day - 21st March 2024 Sunflowers & Socks



Sunflowers and socks...what's any of this got to do with Down Syndrome?!

World Down Syndrome Day is a global awareness day officially observed by the United Nations since 2012. The date, 21st March (i.e. the 3rd month of the year), was chosen to reflect the fact that people with Down Syndrome have 3 copies of chromosome number 21.

Down Syndrome is a naturally occurring genetic condition caused by an extra chromosome. Babies with Down Syndrome are born to parents of all ages, races, religions and background. Down Syndrome usually causes varying degrees of intellectual and physical disability, and some associated medical issues. Approximately half of all children born with Down Syndrome have a heart defect and approximately half have problems with hearing and vision. Everyone with Down Syndrome has a learning disability so it takes longer to learn new information and master new skills; most children with Down Syndrome will learn to walk and talk but they will do so in their own time. Many will use Makaton sign language to help them communicate.

Above all else, children with Down Syndrome are just that – children. Like any other children, they want to have friends, be included, have fun and enjoy life! Our little boy, Seán, who happens to have Down Syndrome definitely believes in having fun and enjoying life! His enthusiastic waving at random strangers, the enormous hugs he gives his big sisters every night, his joy at hearing Baby Shark for the zillionth time, the cheeky grin when he pretends he's going to share a bit of his food, the pride with which he demonstrates a new skill, and the ease with which he puts a smile on the faces of those around him, are the traits and characteristics that define him, not the fact that he has Down Syndrome.

We are delighted that St Mary's have chosen to mark World Down Syndrome Day again this year. We very much appreciate the opportunity to raise awareness and help ensure that all of our children grow up in a caring and inclusive environment that welcomes diversity.

Now, to explain the sunflowers and socks....

*Down Syndrome UK run a **sunflower challenge** for World Down Syndrome Day. They invite children in participating schools to plant sunflowers in advance of World Down Syndrome Day and watch the flowers grow, reflecting on the fact that, just like sunflowers, every child grows and blooms uniquely, in their own time. Every child at St. Mary's will have the opportunity to plant their sunflower next week.*

Rock your socks! *The idea of this campaign, which is observed around the world, is simply to get people talking about Down Syndrome. Socks were chosen as the basis of this international campaign because chromosomes are thought to look a little bit like pairs of socks. Wear your brightest, boldest and/or mismatched socks on **21st March** and when somebody asks you about them, tell them you are raising awareness of Down Syndrome.*

Thank you to Mrs Yorke and the staff at St Mary's as well as all the children and parents who will be joining in the World Down Syndrome Day celebrations and doing their bit to help raise awareness. We are always happy to have a chat and would really encourage children to ask questions and find out more about Down Syndrome and what it means. We've learnt a lot over the last 3 years since Seán burst into our lives and are keen to encourage open conversations with children to help them understand, accept and embrace diversity so that children like Seán can grow up in an inclusive environment.
