Dear parents and carers,








# CATHOLIC LIFE

Our children have been leading beautiful prayer and liturgy services, thinking about Jesus' appearances after his resurrection and what it means to be a follower of Jesus.









# WE HAVE A NEW POPE



## **Habemus Papam**

Pope Leo XIV, born Robert Prevost, is the first American Pope.

He was born in Chicago in 1955 and joined the Order of Augustinians in 1977, before being ordained as a Priest in 1982.

He spent many years in Peru serving as a missionary and latterly as Archbishop.

He has chosen the name Leo. The last pope with this name was Pope Leo XIII, over one hundred years ago, whose work was the basis for Catholic Social Teaching.

As we celebrate this Year of Jubilee when we are called to be Pilgrims of Hope, we give thanks that Pope Leo will continue to speak up for those who are poor or marginalised in our world.



In his first speech,
Pope Leo said, 'We
are disciples of
Christ, Christ goes
before us, and the
world needs his
light. Humanity needs
Christ as a bridge to
be reached by God
and his love. Help us,
and help each other,
build bridges.'

#### Archbishop Bernard has issued the following beautiful statement:

"I welcome the wonderful news of the election of Cardinal Robert Prevost as our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. As he prepared to give us his first blessing as Pope in St Peter's Square he also gave us a message of joyful encouragement, calling us to be bridge-builders who are the light of Christ in the world. As the first Pope from the United States of America he also remembered the people of Chiclayo in Peru where he had served as bishop until 2023.

I have just spent the last few days at Buckfast Abbey with all the Bishops of England and Wales as we prayed for the Cardinals in Conclave and as we waited to hear whom the Holy Spirit would identify as the Successor of Peter. It will be a great joy to serve the Church's mission inspired by the guidance of Pope Leo. All the lay faithful, the Religious and clergy of our Archdiocese are praying for our new Holy Father that he may serve the Church for many years and be richly blessed in his apostolate.









We gathered together as a school for a special assembly to find out more about Pope Leo XIV and what this means to us as a school with strong Augustinian heritage.

We're excited that whether in Rome or Harborne, our Augustinian priests and the Pope are all part of the big Catholic family!






# **EDUCATIONAL VISITS**
