Today, you will have received a copy of the report from our recent Ofsted Inspection (January 2023). We hope that you are as pleased, as we are, to read so many positive comments about our school. Ofsted found our staff to be incredibly committed and hard working and our pupils to be exceptionally well-behaved, tolerant, happy and safe. They also had many good things to say about teaching and learning and our curriculum.

It is great to receive external validation and next steps to support us further and we have lots of ideas for how to make St. Mary's even better. Our behaviour policy, which rewards the successes and achievements of the children; opportunities for wider extra-curricular activities; and planning for personal development was also highlighted as a strength. We will continue to 'reward the successes' of the children, including academic achievement, sporting competitions, behaviour and attendance going forward as this is best practice. We know that many of our parents are supportive of this positive approach and I thank you.

Any necessary changes being made currently to the curriculum and policy is always fully informed, and endorsed by the Governors, and all our policies are found on our school website.

#### St. Mary's Charity Work for Lent...

Some of our year 6 children have already been to the Dementia Drop-In group in the parish centre. They had some interesting conversations and played fun games of bingo with the group members.





Year 6 have also shared a lovely prayer service with their parents.







Raffaelle, Payton, Ben, Alex, Daniel and Anna have created their own fundraising page, selling badges, hats and bookmarks. They have already raised £170.50. This is a marvellous effort children and shows what our young people can do for charity.



Our School Fund is a vital source of income for our school. It pays for the 'extras' such as Christmas activities, theatre or performances as well as subsidising school trips.

Contribution to this fund is entirely voluntary and we are very grateful to those parents who regularly support the school in this way.

However, in the last few years the amount of school fund received has dropped quite significantly. There are probably many reasons for this, but perhaps the most obvious is remembering to send in a donation every year, half term or term.

Several parents make their contribution by standing order and we are very grateful to them all. As we have been accepted as a charity for tax purposes, we can claim the tax on donations to school fund

by parents who are taxpayers if those parents sign a Gift Aid Declaration. This means that for every pound you give we get an extra 28p from the Inland Revenue, helping your donation to go further.

Consequently, by setting up a standing order for say, £2 per month per family, you will guarantee the school a monthly income on which we can reclaim tax.

Over the past 18 months, school fund has supported some of our larger improvement projects, including: -

Curriculum Related (activities & resources) - £5,207.87 New Early Reading Scheme - £8,099.09 Pupil Retreats - £1,958.00 Outdoor/Grounds Improvements - £852.00

Our PTA is also a massive support fundraising for projects in school. We have some new big projects in mind for the future and with shrinking school budgets, we can only do this with your support.

Please get involved if you are not yet supporting school fund and are able. Ask the office for more information and gift aid forms. Sometimes – charity starts at home! Thank you
