In Science this week. Year 6 played the 'Who am I game?', asking questions about characteristics. They learnt to start by asking broad questions and then get more specific.












Year 2 prepared their prayer tables for their Easter learning. They began their Easter journey by learning the story of the Resurrection and asking some 'wondering' questions.

Jewellery



Please do not book holidays for any of the above dates. Further details will be given out nearer the time.




Lego donation for school
