We expect children to read to an adult at home every day. Our younger children are learning to read using the Little Wandle phonics scheme. They need to practise their blending of sounds and word reading all the time at this age. You can help at home and then sign the reading diary. Year 1's will be issued with a **new reading book on a Tuesday**. Please read with your child throughout the week and return the book on a Monday ready for their book to be changed.
