#### Packed Lunches

Please make sure that packed lunches are suitable for school: -

- They should be healthy a small sugary snack is allowed, alongside fruit and yoghurts.
- Cutlery children must not bring in items that can be deemed dangerous, such as knives. Please pre-prepare anything that may need chopping.
- Containers children (and staff) are struggling to open the thermos containers that some children are using for their lunch. Please ensure that containers can easily be opened (ideally by your child).



#### Phones

Children are not allowed to bring phones in to school. All children are picked up by a parent so phones are not needed.
