Homework - Power Project - Science




Light - Our power projects this half term have a Science theme.

Year 3 are learning: - Light

We will be learning that we need light to see things; light can be reflected off surfaces; light from the sun can be dangerous; how shadows are formed. To enhance this learning, children can complete a project at home to bring in for our class display.

We have given some activity ideas below...

- 1. **Light maze**: learn about light travelling in straight lines and reflection by making a light maze. Make a maze using mirrors to reflect light around corners.
- 2. **Creating shadows**: shine a light on an object that is sitting on a piece of paper and draw its shadow. How can you make the shadow change length and direction?



- 3. **Significant Individual Percy Shaw**. Why is Percy Shaw significant when studying light? Research what he created and explain how this invention uses light.
- 4. **Staying safe in the sun** Create an informative poster about how the sun makes light and how the sun can be dangerous. As part of your poster, explain how to keep safe in the sun i.e. wearing a hat...
- 5. **Art using light in art -** create a piece of art work that uses light and dark. When mixing paint what do you add to a colour to make it lighter? What do you add to a colour to make it darker.
