Dear parents and carers,

We've had a wonderful week in school, and I include some of the learning that has taken place in today's newsletter. We've focused on mental health awareness and how to regulate our emotions and behaviours and we've learnt more about what it is like have dyslexia as this week has been dyslexia awareness week. Well done Cecile, in Year 6, for creating your fabulous presentation about Dyslexia and sharing this with the children.

I have noticed an increase of the very large water bottles (particularly the metal ones) being brought in to school. Sometimes these water bottles are swung around in the play ground and pose a risk that another child could be hurt. Your child only needs a light-weight reusable plastic water bottle in school, as I need to put the safety of children first. We do no want any of these expensive water bottles in school either please.

After half-term, all water bottles in school must be light-weight and practical (no metal bottles).

I would also like to remind everybody about the acceptable use of social media. All parents sign a home school agreement when their children join St. Mary's. Within this agreement is the term: -

"Use social media respectfully and never to put in to disrepute the reputation of the school or any staff member".

I am sometimes made aware of grumbles that are aired in WhatsApp groups. The year group WhatsApp groups are great for sharing information and should be run by the PTA reps. This is not the forum to be complaining about school and I would like to ask that any issues about school comes through the correct channels and is made known by phoning or emailing school; or by speaking to the SLT member on the gate. Governors and staff are incredibly proud of all that takes place at St. Mary's and I ask for your support in continuing to celebrate what the school offers for the education and personal development of the children. We are full as a school with a very long waiting list, which is testament to the great reputation the school has.

Going forward - we're trying to use one channel of communication with parents... we're exploring how we can use School Gateway for most methods of communication i.e. parents' evening appointments, newsletters, paying for school meals and trips, and so forth... on Monday, we will be opening up the parents' evening tab so that you can book your appointment. If you are finding it difficult to log on, please phone the school office so that we can assist you. We will not be renewing e-schools as we are moving to one line of communication going forward.

Thank you to those of you who have donated to our harvest collection so far. We have a harvest Mass on Wednesday 23rd October where we would like to have all donations on display. Please donate at least one item. If every child brought in one thing, we would have 420 items to send to SIFA Fireside. Thank you for your continued support and I hope that you have a great weekend.

On Monday, you will receive a message of School Gateway regarding parents evening appointments.

We no longer have e-schools so booking for Parents' Evening this October will take place using School Gateway. You can log in on Monday using your personal information i.e. Parent name and child's Date of Birth.

> Parents' evening appointments will be carried over two days – Tuesday 22nd October 2024 and Thursday 24th October 2024.

All appointments take place in the school hall. There will be an opportunity to look at your child's books following your appointment.

The appointment will last for ten minutes and timings will be strictly kept to. Please <u>do not</u> arrive any more than <u>5 minutes early for your appointment</u> to help us with numbers in the school hall.

It is better if you do not bring your children (including pre school children and babies) to your appointment so that you can focus on the information given to you. We do realise that this is not always possible. Children of St. Mary's will be taken down to the Year 2 classroom if you do bring them, where they will be taken care of by the staff.

We will be asking all parents to complete a parent questionnaire on the night. Please look out for this. We always take feedback on board to constantly improve and we love to hear all the things that you think are going well too.
