Year 3 have been enjoying their computing lessons, learning about the components of a network in school and how they all connect to the Internet.




Year 4 news: -

Scientists in Year 4 have demonstrated the behaviour of particles in solids, liquids and gases.




Year 5 news: -

Year 5 discussed and displayed different little acts of kindness that they can act out each day.




Reception class made friendship bracelets to show how they care for each other.





Parents' evening consultations can now be booked for your child using e-schools

Beschools

When you log on to e-schools, you will have the opportunity to book an appointment to see your child's teacher. Booking opens on <u>Monday 2nd October 2023 at 12pm</u> and closes on Friday 13th October 2023 at 12pm.

Parents' evening appointments will be carried over two days – Tuesday 24th October 2023 and Wednesday 25th October 2023.

All appointments take place in the school hall. There will be an opportunity to look at your child's books following your appointment.

The appointment will last for ten minutes and timings will be strictly kept to. Please <u>do not</u> arrive any more than <u>5 minutes early for your appointment</u> to help us keep numbers in school to a minimum.

It is better if you do not bring your children (including pre school children and babies) to your appointment so that you can focus on the information given to you. We do realise that this is not always possible. Children of St. Mary's will be taken down to the Year 2 classroom if you do bring them, where they will be taken care of by the staff.

We will be asking all parents to complete a parent questionnaire on the night. Please look out for this. We always take feedback on board to constantly improve and we love to hear all the things that you think are going well too.

There will also be the opportunity to visit our book fair and to take home any pre-loved uniform.

Healthy Snacks

Please may we remind all parents that only healthy snacks are permitted in school
your child may have a piece of fruit at break time. Do not send your child in with crisps, sweets or chocolate as they will not be able to consume this on site.
Please also be aware that we do not allow nuts, in order to reduce the chance of children with allergies from having a reaction.






If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions between I September and 31 October 2023. It is important that you <u>submit your</u> <u>application by 31 October 2023</u>. Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2023 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after I March 2024, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.

We know this is an important time for you our Year 6 children. and we encourage you to find out as much as you can about local schools and how the admissions process works before you make your application. Please do not hesitate to contact the office or a member of SLT if you need support with your application.
