Parking problems

This car should **not be parked here**. There is a gap between the end of the yellow 'zig zag' lines and the yellow lines and parking bays. The adjacent parking bays do not permit cars parked there between 3 and 4 pm.

This car is **parked on the yellow** 'zig zags' opposite the church entrance at 3:30 pm. No car should be parked here at all – the 'zig zag' reserves that space for emergency vehicles.

These two examples show ILLEGAL parking – i.e. breaking the Law, parking! Please park responsibly, giving good witness to your children – it is, after all, the children's safety that you are putting at risk.
