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Reading diaries

Please remember to sign the reading diary for your child when you have read with them at home. Children learn to read best when they read to an adult every day, who can support them with intonation, pronunciation, new words and meaning. Children have daily reading lessons in school, but make most progress when they read at home too.

Hair styles

We can not allow extreme hair styles in school. This is a reminder that long hair must be tied back. All hair should be one colour. Extreme cuts and lines are not allowed. Large bows and coloured beads are not allowed (small bows and head bands are allowed). All hair styles must be neat and sensible and not a distraction to others. Thank you.

Collecting your children at the end of day

Please take time to re-read the end of day collection plan as we have noticed an increasing amount of people not following it. Teachers will release children to those following the queuing system only.
When queuing, please leave room for over-taking in the lanes. Nobody should bypass the queue and come straight up the middle. The middle is so that a larger amount of people can leave school grounds safely.
This system is to keep us all safe in times of Covid. SLT will approach anybody who is not following it and you will be asked to join the queue correctly.

End of day

Please take note of the new end of day timings... following a review of end of day routines: -

At 3:10pm, Reception parents (once children are in full time) are to walk down the drive on the **left** hand side (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:15pm, Year 1 and Year 2 parents are to walk down the drive on the **right** hand side (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:20pm, siblings will be released to parents, who will walk down on the **right** hand side (as shown by the blue arrows). Your children will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 3 and Year 4 parents are to walk down the drive on the **left** hand side (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 5 and Year 6 parents are to walk down the drive on the **right** hand side (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way. END OF DAY COLLECTION POINTS AND TIMES -



Please note: -The school has a walking home policy that states that children should be picked up by the parents. We encourage children to only walk home by themselves in the Summer term of Year 6.

Role of the Treasurer-

The Treasurer ensures accurate financial records are kept and best practice procedures are followed for counting money, banking and making payments. The Secretary supports the Chair to build effective communication links between the school and the association and maintains accurate records. They take they minutes at the meetings and keep an update on actions.

The office bearers ensure that the committee fulfils its responsibilities. They advocate for the PTA and act in accordance with the PTA's constitution and financial matters. They work as a team member through support and assisting with projects.

Covid Update

Cases of those testing positive for the Covid-19 virus have risen this week. We are currently at stage 2.2 as a school and have reached stage 3 (5 or more cases) in 2 of our classes.

As a school, we are keen to ensure that we protect children's education and limit disruption for parents and so we are putting in extra precautionary measures next week to limit children's contact with each other, in the hope that numbers will begin to fall again.

The measures we are putting in are outlined in our Covid outbreak plan but include: -

- Ensuring that affected areas (classes/rooms where threshold has been met) are deep cleaned before next use.
- Ensuring that any enclosed spaces are adequately ventilated (this is why the windows are open).
- Sibling/household <u>close contacts</u> over the age of 5 daily LFD test for 7 days.
- Promoting prompt isolation and LFD testing.
- Reverting to video-link assemblies.
- Having separate areas for break-time and lunch.
- Having lessons outside if the weather allows.
- Increased hand washing routines.
- Enhanced cleaning regimes.
- Staff social distancing and use of PPE as appropriate.

We are hopeful that by following these measures for a week, numbers will decrease. However, if numbers do continue to rise, I will write to the affected classes in the week.

Currently, we are able to run before and after school clubs, and the leaders will also put in extra precautions to keep the children in year groups. However, if more classes move to stage 3, I may cancel these clubs. I will give as much notice as possible if reaching this decision.
