Year 3 led a fantastic Mass ahead of the Celebration of Christ the King this Sunday.






#### There is no Mass next week. Our next Mass will be: -Whole School Mass in Church - 8.12.23 at 9:30am -Feast of Immaculate Conception

Reception class have been comparing height in maths lessons. They used giant blocks to build towers shorter and taller than themselves and their friends.










#### Year I news: -

Year 1 are enjoying their new book, 'The Barnabus Project' by The Fan Brothers. So far, they have sequenced and retold the story.










Year 2 news: -




#### Other key dates for your diary




