It has been a busy and thought-provoking week at St. Mary's, filled with opportunities for prayer, reflection, and learning together as a community. Here are some of our highlights: -

Other Faiths Week

This week, our learning has focused on celebrating Other Faiths. As Catholics, it is important for us to understand and respect the beliefs of others, recognising how different faiths can work alongside each other as we live out our Catholic virtues and mission statement. The children have enjoyed exploring traditions and practices from other religions, helping them to grow in respect, empathy, and appreciation for the diverse world we live in.

Remembrance

November is a time of remembrance, and we have reflected on why it is important to remember those who have died and to pray for peace. This week, the children have taken part in a whole-school remembrance service and 2-minute silence; and we have celebrated a Remembrance Mass and child-led prayer services throughout the week too. Our curriculum work has also helped children understand the sacrifices made by others. Through wearing poppies, observing silence, and offering prayers, our pupils have shown great reverence and maturity in honouring those who gave their lives for our freedom.

Advent

As Advent approaches, we begin to prepare our hearts and minds for this special season. St. Mary's works alongside a group of primary schools and Bishop Challoner Secondary School, collectively known as the Tolkien group of schools. Together, we aim to make a difference for families across Birmingham:-

We are supporting two initiatives this year:

- 1. Toy Appeal We are asking for donations of new, unwrapped toys to support families in Birmingham this Christmas. Donations can be sent into school over the next month.
- 2. Birmingham Christmas Shelter St Catherine of Siena Primary School supports Birmingham shelter each year, providing food and clothing for those in need. Last year, over 400 guests received fresh clothes and toiletries. This year, they have asked for our help in collecting toiletries, biscuits, crisps, cordial, and clothing. Donations can be brought to the school office in the coming weeks.

We know times are challenging, and there is no obligation to give if you need to prioritise your own family. However, we are always humbled by the generosity of St. Mary's families, and we thank you in advance if you are able to support these important initiatives.






Year 4 Mass - 13.10.25 Remembrance



Reception learnt about Sikhism and the festival of Vaisakhi.






V from Year 1 told his friends all about his beliefs as a Hindu and answered questions about his faith.







Year 4 expanded their knowledge about Judaism with a visit to Singers Hill Synagogue.


























Monday 17th November - Non School Uniform Day

SAFEGUARDING

Bullying in school is a serious issue that can have a lasting effect on children's emotional well-being, academic performance, and social development. St Mary's are legally required to have an anti-bullying policy (this is contained within our Behaviour and Relationship Policy and can be found on our website), but effective prevention goes beyond policy—it involves fostering a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment where all children feel valued. By promoting positive behaviour, teaching empathy, and encouraging open communication, we play a vital role in preventing bullying and supporting children in developing healthy relationships.

How can I help my child if I think they're being bullied?

- Open up a conversation. ...
- Listen to their experience....
- Give them time before talking if they need it. ...
- Check in with them. ...
- · Keep a log of the bullying. ...
- Help them build up their self-esteem. ...
- Encourage them to spend time with peers who treat them well.

Let a member of staff know

Is my child too ill for school?

Okay to Attend (if otherwise well):

- · Coughs & colds (no high temperature)
- · Cold sores
- · Conjunctivitis
- · COVID-19 (mild symptoms only)
- · Hand, foot & mouth
- · Head lice
- · Ringworm (after treatment starts)
- · Slapped cheek syndrome
- · Sore throat (no high temperature)
- · Threadworms



- · High temperature (any cause)
- · Chickenpox until spots crust over (~5 days)
- · COVID-19 if high temperature or feeling unwell
- · Ear infection if high temperature or severe pain
- · Impetigo until sores crust or 48 hrs after antibiotics
- · Measles at least 4 days after rash
- · Scarlet fever 24 hrs after antibiotics
- · Tonsillitis if high temperature
- · Vomiting/Diarrhoea 48 hrs after last episode
