#### The Stations of the Cross


"Truly this was the Son of God"






Year 3 wrote 'Breaking News' articles all about what happened on Palm Sunday

Year 4 prepared witness statements and acted out Jesus' trial under Pontius Pilate and then showed their written work to Miss Price.












Year 3 reflected on what it was like for Jesus as he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane.


Year 6 re-enacted the events of the Garden of Gethsemane






Year 6 studied scripture, images and hymns to examine Jesus' title, The Suffering Servant
