


Year 6 have been praying the rosary, with Mark 10 mission.






### Maths


With every book sold, the school receives a percentage towards books for schools so we appreciate you supporting our Book Fair!

#### Parents' Consultation Evening




Parents' evening appointments will be carried over two days - Tuesday 21st October 2025 and Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2025.



# ONLINE SAFETY-ROBLOX



#### What is Roblox?

Roblox is an online platform where users can play games, create games, and socialise with others. It's especially popular with children and teens. Most games on Roblox are created by users, not professional developers. Roblox is free to download and play, but it includes in-game purchases using a virtual currency called Robux. Children can chat, add friends, and join groups, which makes parental supervision essential.

#### Help your child enjoy Roblox safely with these ten simple tips:

- (1). Supervise and stay involved know what your child is playing and talk to them about it.
- (2). Set up parental controls use Roblox's settings to manage chat, game access, and privacy.
  - (3). Talk about online safety teach your child not to share personal information.
- (4). Encourage open communication tell them that they can talk to you about anything they see online.
- (5). Use the block and report tools show your child how to block and report inappropriate behaviour.
  - (6). Monitor chat and friends List regularly check who your child is talking to.
  - (7). Choose age-appropriate games help your child find games suitable for their age.
    - (8). Set time limits balance Roblox with other activities and rest.
    - (9). Use a family email sign up with an email you can monitor.
    - (10). Stay informed visit the Roblox Parents Guide for updates and safety tools.
