Year I have been busy studying the story 'The Journey Home', by Frann Preston-Gannon.


The children have designed posters about the animals that had to leave their homes, just like refugees.







Year 2 have been thinking about ways we can welcome refugees and make them feel at home. This week they have written poems and welcome letters to share their compassion and empathy.
















Year 3 created comic strips to represent the thoughts and feelings of refugees after fleeing to start a new life.

Year 4 have been thinking about 'empathy' for refugee week. They filled in shoes with welcoming thoughts and intentions for the refugees.












Year 5 discussed feelings and emotions of refugees who flee their country on the basis of the book 'Boy 87' by Ele Fountain.










Year 6 wrote beautiful pieces of Compassion poetry in their English lessons.

On Friday afternoon, the children shared their Refugee learning with other classes - led by Year 6 who shared the poetry that they had written.






### Love your neighbour




### Bottles for Parish Fete - WB 26.6.23
