

Stunning Start

Explore Exodus 3:7-8. Carry out research into what Jesus actually did for people who were sick, poor, marginalised and rejected. Children to read the stories and create a piece of artwork to represent one of these stories. Children to include scripture in the artwork.

Science – Light UNCRC Article 28

- Recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines.
- Explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.
- Explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes.
- Explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

UNCRC Article 31

Children will explore Baroque music, learning about its features like recitative, canon, ground bass, and fugue. They'll actively engage in vocal improvisation, play canon sections, compose a ground bass, notate patterns, and study famous Baroque composers. The unit concludes with the students learning and performing a fugue, demonstrating their grasp of Baroque music elements.
