
#### Catholic Life in School

Year 5 made wonderful river models, showing how a river is formed from its source to its river mouth. All of the models showed creativity, attention to detail and fantastic learning.








Year 6 wrote wonderful fact files about our local constituency in Edgbaston.



This includes inviting an adult (parent/grandparent/aunty/uncle) in to read with the children in a given slot at the very beginning or end of the school day.

We have taken this decision for a number of reasons, one of which being that we do not wish this celebration of reading to be a burden on parents. This is not to say that we won't dress up in future years. We are hoping to make each year unique with different themes - so there will be other opportunities for dress up in the future.

We are having a week in school where a range of careers will be celebrated. We would like to get the children excited by the breadth of careers available to them when they are older. We welcome anybody who would be willing to talk to the children about a job they do.


























"During this Lent, let us all ask the Lord: Make our hearts like yours."





Next half term, each class will be studying 'Lent' in their RE lessons.

Please see below for further information about what will be covered in each year group.

year R In Reception, the children are introduced to some of the Church's customs for the Season of Lent, e.g. doing things for others. Children will hear about Lent being a special time of prayer and a season when Christians try to follow Christ by what they do. They will also learn about Lent being a time of saying sorry and asking God's forgiveness for things that they have done wrong.

Year

1

In YI, we will develop the children's knowledge and understanding of Lent as a time of change and of growing to be more like Jesus by following his example. In the unit the children will explore various aspects of Jesus' message and ways in which Christians can apply these to real life situations. The children will also know that Jesus, in his words and action, gave people a chance to change, and that Lent is a special time when we too are given that same chance.

Year

In Y2, the children will develop their knowledge and understanding of the Season of Lent and the importance of the theme of forgiveness during this time. The children will have a greater understanding of the need to receive God's forgiveness and the qualities of a forgiving person. The children will be able to express the difficulties associated with being a forgiving person.

Year

In Y3, the children will learn to appreciate that during Lent Christians resolve to change and try to become more like Christ. The children will be introduced to new Gospel stories about Jesus bringing change into the lives of people he encountered e.g. those who were sick or in need.

year

4

In Y4, the children will further explore some of the customs and practices associated with the celebration of the Season of Lent. Through the life and teaching of Christ they will learn about prayer, fasting and almsgiving and the forgiveness that God offers to those who believe in him. The children will know that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a celebration of the gift of forgiveness. They will understand that the Beatitudes of Jesus provide a guide for Christians to follow Christ by the ay they live their lives.

Year

5

In YS, the children will think about the concept of 'temptation' as they study the temptations of Jesus. Children will be given the opportunity to reflect on what nurtures and damages human relationships they will study some important texts from the New Testament about Christian living and will learn about the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a Sacrament of Healing and God's forgiveness.

year 6 In Y6, the children will be given some opportunities to develop their knowledge and understanding of prayer, fasting and almsgiving as important Lenten activities. They will examine the teaching of Jesus about these things and think about why they might be important activities for Christians today. In this unit children will also explore the Church's teaching on the forgiveness and God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They will know about the importance attached to asking for God's mercy and forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and understand how the Examination of Conscience can help people prepare to celebrate this Sacrament.

Our School Fund is a vital source of income for our school. It pays for the 'extras' such as Christmas activities, theatre or performances as well as subsidising school trips.

Contribution to this fund is entirely voluntary and we are very grateful to those parents who regularly support the school in this way.

However, in the last few years the amount of school fund received has dropped quite significantly.

There are probably many reasons for this, but perhaps the most obvious is remembering to send in a donation every year, half term or term.

Several parents make their contribution by standing order and we are very grateful to them all.

As we have been accepted as a charity for tax purposes, we can claim the tax on donations to school fund

by parents who are taxpayers if those parents sign a Gift Aid Declaration.

This means that for every pound you give we get an extra 28p from the Inland Revenue,

helping your donation to go further.

Consequently, by setting up a standing order for say, £2 per month per family, you will guarantee the school a monthly income on which we can reclaim tax.

Over the past 18 months, school fund has supported some of our larger improvement projects, including: -

Curriculum Related (activities & resources) - £5,207.87

New Early Reading Scheme - £8,099.09

Pupil Retreats - £1,958.00

Outdoor/Grounds Improvements - £852.00

Our PTA is also a massive support fundraising for projects in school. We have some new big projects in mind for the future and with shrinking school budgets, we can only do this with your support.

#### Do not book holidays during term time

This is a reminder that holidays during term time are unauthorised. If you intend to take your child out of school during term time, we ask that you complete a holiday request form at least 2 weeks prior to the leave date where possible. Parents may be fined by the Local Authority for taking unauthorised leave of absence. Children need to be in school every day so please ensure holidays are only booked during school holiday time.

Good attendance, continues to be a school and government priority.

Remember below 95% is a concern and below 90% is classed as persistent absence. If you have any problems with regards to getting your child to school or you are struggling to improve your child's attendance, please speak to Mrs. Yorke or Mrs. Davis.
