

Year 2 have been using their observation skills in Science this week and thinking about whether larger bulbs will produce larger plants.









Year 3 news: In PSHE this week, Year 3 have been discussing what stereotypes exist for certain jobs.

We've had some fantastic entries for our Science Week poster competition. The theme for the entries is 'Time' and submit your entries before the end of term if you've not yet entered.





World Down Syndrome Day - 21st March 2024 Sunflowers & Socks

In March - we create awareness for those who have Down Syndrome.

World Down Syndrome Day is a global awareness day officially observed by the United Nations since 2012. The date, 21st March (i.e. the 3rd month of the year), was chosen to reflect the fact that people with Down Syndrome have 3 copies of chromosome number 21.

Down Syndrome is a naturally occurring genetic condition caused by an extra chromosome. Babies with Down Syndrome are born to parents of all ages, races, religions and background. Down Syndrome usually causes varying degrees of intellectual and physical disability, and some associated medical issues. Approximately half of all children born with Down Syndrome have a heart defect and approximately half have problems with hearing and vision. Everyone with Down Syndrome has a learning disability so it takes longer to learn new information and master new skills; most children with Down Syndrome will learn to walk and talk but they will do so in their own time. Many will use Makaton sign language to help them communicate.

We are marking World Down Syndrome Day again this year. At St .Mary's, we do encourage and inclusive and caring environment that welcomes diversity.

Now, to explain the sunflowers and socks....

Down Syndrome UK run a **sunflower challenge** for World Down Syndrome Day. We have begun planting our Sunflowers today and will continue to plant them in to next week. As the children watch the flowers grow, they will reflect on that just like sunflowers, every child grows and blooms uniquely, in their own time.









Rock your socks! The idea of this campaign, which is observed around the world, is simply to get people talking about Down Syndrome. Socks were chosen as the basis of this international campaign because chromosomes are thought to look a little bit like pairs of socks. Wear your brightest, boldest and/or mismatched socks on **21st March** and when somebody asks you about them, tell them you are raising awareness of Down Syndrome.



Thank you to all the staff, children and parents for supporting our World Down Syndrome Day celebrations and doing their bit to help raise awareness. Looking forward to seeing those socks next week.
