A few parents have asked about the best way to communicate with school now that we no longer have e-schools. As an SLT, we are currently working on a communications policy which should help you with this but for now, the best way to pass on a message is:-

- 1) speak to a member of SLT, who is on the blue gate every morning
- 2) send an email in to enquiry or phone enquiry, with a message to be passed on
- 3) speak to the teacher at the end of the day at pick up
- 4) request a meeting with a teacher (or SLT member) through email or phoning school

All messages are passed on to the most relevant member of staff. If a reply is needed, you should receive this within 3-5 days (or on day I if it is an urgent concern or safeguarding issue - ask to speak to a DSL).

Information for parents about learning and progress is formally reported once a term through parents' evenings. We are also trialling a half-termly newsletter, where you will receive key information about the year group, and their curriculum. Other information about homework will also be communicated. As a whole school approach, you can support your child at home by doing daily reading, spellings and TT Rockstars.

Please rest assured that if the school has any additional concerns i.e. if a child is needing extra support with their work, we will contact you - but otherwise assume that your child is making expected progress and you will receive a fuller update at October's parents' evening.

## October - Pray the Rosary




