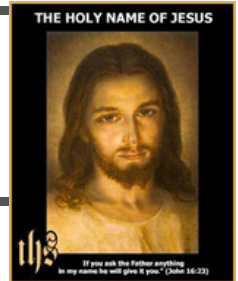

Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed Him.'*

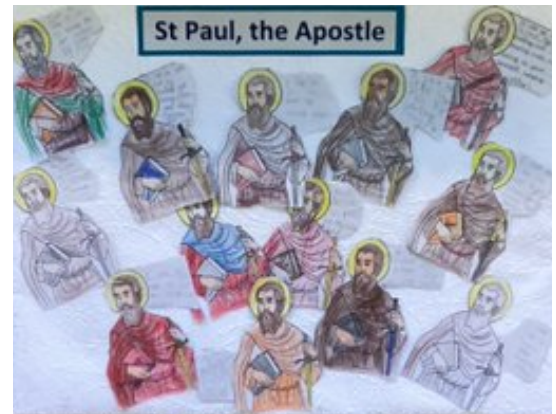
Reflecting on this week's Gospel message, the children:

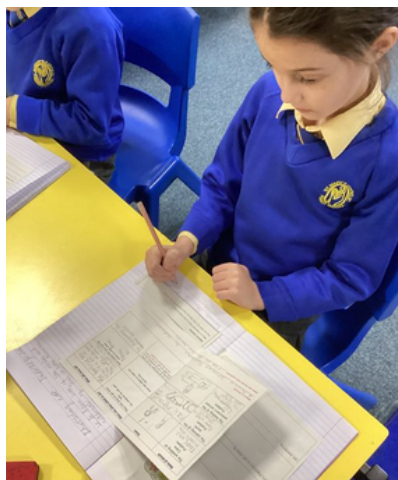

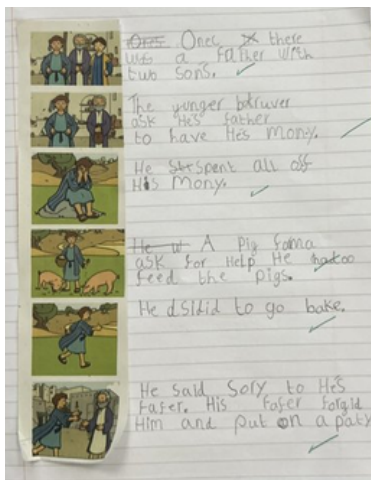


Look at our wonderful RE learning this week: -

These children have really stood out this week and received a Remarkable RE award from Miss Heath.

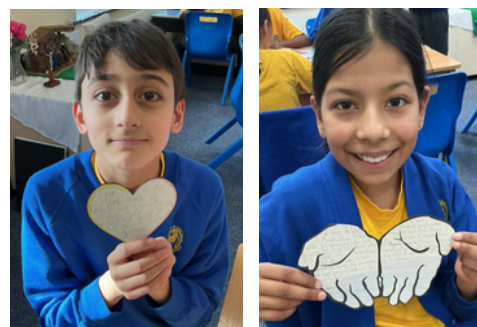


Year 6 have been revising their knowledge of the seven sacraments, finding stories in the Bible linked to each sacrament.

Year 5 Prayer Service - 30.01.26

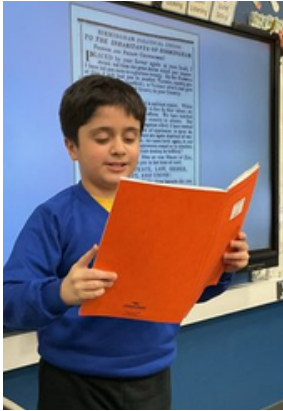

St. Mary's loves to **Write!**



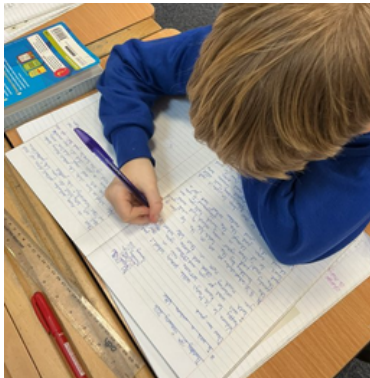
Year 6 have loved writing and performing their persuasive speeches about the Great Reform Act.

If you are a parent who would like to attend and support walking to and from the library, please let the Year 6 staff know.



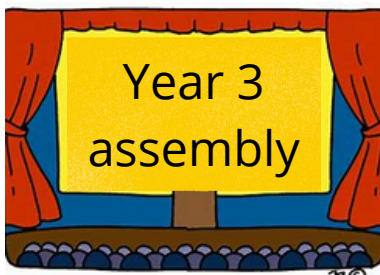
NSPCC Number Day – 6.2.26

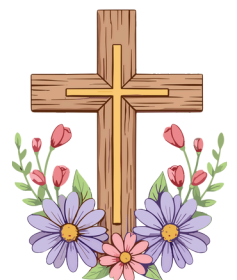


Year 1 Grove Park Fieldwork Visit – 06.02.26

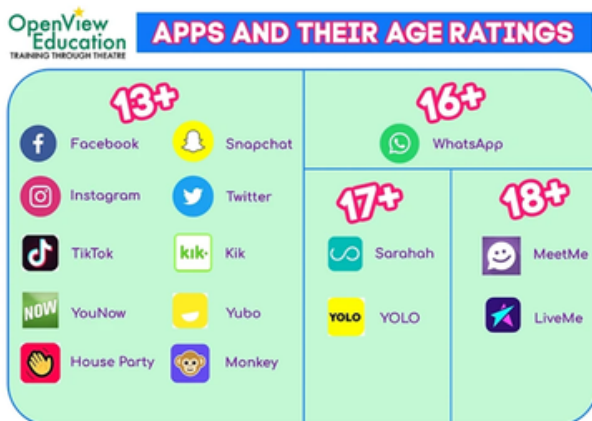
Year 4 trip to Bosworth Battlefield – 9th February

Safer Internet Day – 10.2.26

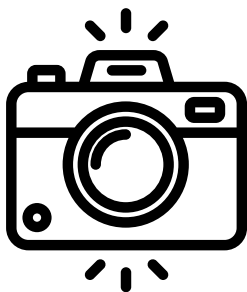

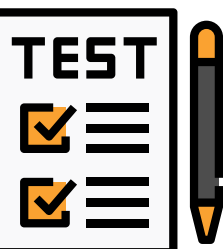

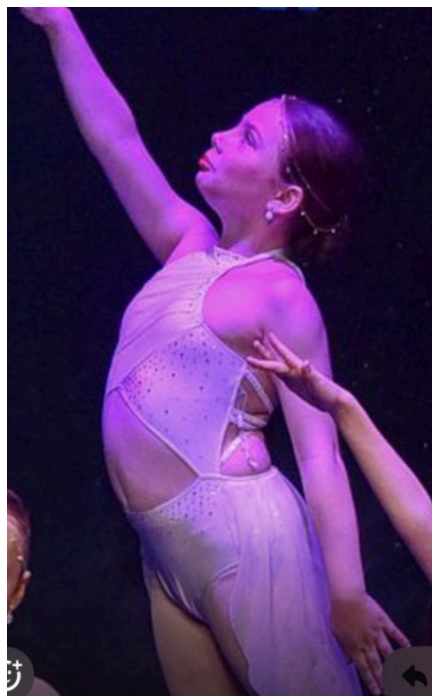

Parent Webinar – County Lines and Criminal Exploitation

3rd March 2026 – 7pm to 8.30pm

Ivision Trust (formerly Pace), a national charity working to keep children safe from exploitation, is offering a free interactive webinar for parents about criminal exploitation with a focus on county lines.

What you will learn:

Learn what county lines is

Understand what is happening in your local area

Learn how exploiters groom children

Understand the signs that your child might be at risk

Know where to access support and advice if you have concerns

The webinar will be interactive and there will be an opportunity to ask questions, share concerns and connect with others. The session will be delivered with a parent whose child has been a victim of exploitation and they will share their experience along with providing advice on the risks.
