Parish Fair

I am delighted to share that our Parish Fair on Saturday 23rd November was a tremendous success, bringing together our school, families, and parish in a wonderful celebration of faith and community. It was inspiring to see so many of you attending, supporting, and contributing so generously to our fundraising efforts. Through your kindness, and the incredible dedication of our PTA, an outstanding £2,850 was raised, which will be shared between the parish and the school. Advent - a season of hope

This weekend we enter the season of Advent, a time of spiritual preparation before Christmas. The first candle on our Advent wreath – the Prophet's Candle – represents hope, reminding us that Jesus is coming. Families are encouraged to use the prayer and reflection on page 3 of this newsletter to explore this theme together at home. Our Diocesan mission is to 'form Christ-centred pilgrims of hope with kind hearts, questioning minds, a thirst for knowledge, and a hunger for justice'. We fully embrace this mission as we move into the next liturgical season.

Our work on Catholic Social Action Theme - Dignity of the Human Person

The theme of the dignity of the human person has been central in our learning this term. Children have been taught that every individual is created in the image of God and therefore deserves respect, care, and compassion. Through lessons, prayer, and practical links throughout the curriculum, children have explored key principles such as recognising the worth of each person, standing against injustice, and valuing diversity. Embedded across the curriculum and the terrific texts that we read, children are encouraged to see themselves and others as unique and precious, and to act responsibly in promoting fairness and kindness. In doing so, the school community lives out Catholic Social Teaching, ensuring that pupils not only understand the principle of human dignity but also apply it in their daily lives, both within school and in the wider world. A fantastic display has been created for our school hall to show case this learning.



Advent Charity Work

Thank you for your generous support of our Christmas charities. We already have a wonderful collection of toys for our Toy Appeal in the foyer; alongside food donations for Fr Hudson's and Birmingham Shelter; and clothing for St. Vincent De Paul. Our children are taking the lead in driving our charity initiatives, choosing to support a number of causes that are close to their hearts. Details of these charities and how you can help are included later in this newsletter. It is inspiring to see our pupils living out their faith through action, showing generosity and compassion to those most in need. Corporal Acts of Mercy

The Corporal Acts of Mercy are practical ways in which we live out the Gospel message by caring for those in need, and this Advent each year group will take responsibility for one act. Reception will focus on feeding the hungry by making Christmas cards and decorating boxes to package donations for Fr Hudson's Care, and families are asked to support by sending in items and boxes. Year 1 and Year 2 will reflect on sheltering the homeless through creating blessing bags and prayer cards to accompany donations for St Catherine of Siena – Birmingham Christmas Shelter. Years 3 and 4 will live out visiting the sick by arranging visits to local care homes – they're also supporting our local toy appeal. And finally, Years 5 and 6 will support St Vincent de Paul by focusing on clothing the naked, organising and sorting clothing donations. Together, these projects allow our pupils to connect their learning with Catholic Social Teaching, showing compassion, responsibility, and faith in action during this season of Advent. 
















Penitential Service for Years 4-6 - 1.12.25

Do not book holidays during term time
