Dear parents and carers,

6th April 2023

We have come to the end of another term and we're all ready to break up and celebrate Easter. The most important day in our faith. We have had such a special Holy Week in school, as we have been led by the children to Jesus' cross through our prayer and liturgy. Year 3 showed us the importance of servant leadership in their recreation of the Last Supper. Year 4 taught us about the anguish Jesus felt in the Garden of Gethsemane, as he was betrayed by one of his own and arrested. Year 5 helped us reflect on all those involved in the persecution of Jesus and how Pilate 'washed his hands' of the whole affair. Today Year 6 led us in our stations of the Cross, and it was lovely to see so many parents and members of the Parish, in the Church. On Sunday, we will celebrate Jesus' resurrection and on behalf of the Governors and all the staff, I wish you all a very happy Easter.

Included in this newsletter are key dates for the Summer term. Please continue to check the dates page of the newsletter for any additions to these dates as the weeks go on. As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, there are two more potential strike days planned for Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May. What are the Stations of the Cross?

The Stations of the Cross – or the Way of the Cross – is a Lenten devotion which helps us to reflect prayerfully on Jesus' final steps on the way to his crucifixion and death. It marks 14 different stages of Christ's Passion from the moment he was condemned to death, to receiving the Cross and then the events on the walk to his crucifixion.

Dear Jesus,

Help us to show our love for you. Prepare our minds, hearts and souls to follow You on Your final journey on the road to Calvary. Thank you Jesus for being our friend and for dying for us. Give us strength to carry Your cross with You.



Year 6 retold the Stations of the Cross and linked the suffering of Jesus, to the suffering and persecution that still takes place today.







The children have taken part in the Big Lent Walk. We have walked an impressive 200km and have raised £320 so far. We're incredibly proud of the children.










