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Reading diaries

Please remember to sign the reading diary for your child when you have read with them at home. Children learn to read best when they read to an adult every day, who can support them with intonation, pronunciation, new words and meaning. Children have daily reading lessons in school, but make most progress when they read at home too.

Parish car park and picking up your child at the end of the day

At the end of the school day, please remain in your lines whilst waiting to pick up your children and be patient if somebody is in front of you. Once you have collected your child, leave down the middle of the drive way. **Do not lean or stand between the cars that are parked.**

Leave a good gap between you and the car. Do not allow your children to run around by the cars and in the car park. Some cars have been damaged causing distress to staff and parishioners.





Parent Governor ballot

You should have now received your ballot paper for parent governor. The ballot box is in the porch outside the office window. Each parent of a child in school is entitled to one vote only. The vote is open for one week until **next Thursday at 12.30pm**

Reading bags not rucksacks please.

Children should be bringing reading bags please in to school rather than rucksacks. Any children who are bringing rucksacks need to keep them at the 'rucksack stop' as there is not room for them to be safely kept on school pegs.

Online Safety



Stay up to date with everything that is happening at St. Mary's by following us on our Twitter Page and giving us more likes!!! Do you know what conversations your children are having online?

Please monitor your child when they are talking with their friends whilst playing games online and if they are communicating via social media groups. Some children are saying unkind things to each other and this is then brought back in to school. School will continue to educate all children about the correct use of the Internet and social media so please support us in enforcing this at home.

Covid Update

As I'm sure you are aware, currently there are a significant number of cases of COVID nationally and the new variant spreads very easily, but cases in school remain very low.

Even if cases rise, our priority is to keep the school open. The biggest difficulty we may face is staff absence but we will do our best to keep classes and school open. To support us, it is vital that we all play our part : If children have symptoms, if they have a new continuous cough, loss of taste and smell, or a temperature, they will be expected to isolate whilst poorly and take a Lateral Flow Test (LFT). If tests remain negative, your child may return to school, when they feel better. If positive, the result should be reported on gov.uk and isolation needs to continue.

The new Omicron variant reportedly presents a different set of symptoms- these include fatigue, headaches, and a sore throat. These, however, are not officially confirmed. If your child shows those symptoms, then you may consider doing an LFT as well.

If someone in your household tests positive or if children are confirmed as a contact, they are still allowed to come to school but they are requested to carry out an LFT test every day for 7 days. If the test is negative, then they can come to school.

If your child receives a positive PCR test, they must isolate for at least 7 days. On days 6 and 7, they can do an LFT and if both are negative and they no longer have symptoms, they will be free to return on day 8.
