Year 6 Mass - Holy name of Mary


On Wednesday, Year 6 led us in our assembly dedicated to the Holy name of Mary.

and Year 3 children will attend too. All parents are welcome to attend.




Roald Dahl Day

Year 3 did their best rhinoceros impressions to show how Roald Dahl described the antagonist, Miss Trunchbull, in his book Matilda




Year 4 enjoyed learning all about the BFG and showed fantastic comprehension skills when discussing the book.

Year 5 historians worked to chronology order events from the Anglo-Saxon era.










Year 6 news: Year 6 classified items in Science and played 'What am I' using their knowledge of classification.


