
St. Oscar Romero was a

Our RE learning this half term

We will be studying the following units in our RE lessons: -

The Story of the People of God

In this unit, children will be given opportunities to develop their knowledge and understanding of the structure of the Bible and the forms of literature that are found in the different books. The children will be introduced to stories of significant people in the Old Testament. They will discover what some of these stories tell us about their relationship with God.

Prayers in the Lives of Followers of Christ

In this unit, children gain a greater knowledge and understanding of the traditional prayers of the Church and some of the signs and actions associated with prayer. They will also study some prayers that are found in the scriptures and engage in the study of the Mass as the central prayer for Catholic Christians. The unit will be concluded with a study of some customs of prayer in other religions.

Swimming technique: Developing front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke strokes, maintaining good body position and posture, and coordinating arm and leg movements.

Safe self-rescue: Recognizing and responding to danger, using flotation devices to stay afloat, and reaching safety and seeking help.

Swimming safety: Staying safe and responsible in and around water. Assessment:

Children will be assessed on their ability to swim 25 metres unaided and on their ability to complete a safe self-rescue.

Homework

Homework supports children's learning and is an important extension of the work we do in school. Following our curriculum maps will help you, as parents, to understand school better and give you the opportunity to help your child at home.



Homework - reading

We expect children to read to an adult at home every day.

Most children in Year 6 can read independently, but share this time with them and ask them about the book i.e. whether they are enjoying the story and what do they think will happen next? Sign the reading diary so that the teachers know how reading is going at home.
