



Year 3 have enjoyed their visits to Harborne Library this term.










Year 4 news: -

Year 5 have been exploring sentence structures using Alan Peat examples. We came up with some fantastic sentences to use next week in our exciting writing!









Year 6 news: -

St. Mary's Live Simply Approach to Christmas




As an alternative to Christmas cards this year, our CAFOD club children have chosen to support the 'World Gifts' charity appeal.



Do not book holidays during term time

This is a reminder that holidays during term time are unauthorised. If you intend to take your child out of school during term time, we ask that you complete a holiday request form at least 2 weeks prior to the leave date where possible. Parents may be fined by the Local Authority for taking unauthorised leave of absence. Children need to be in school every day so please ensure holidays are only booked during school holiday time.
