

## Our children and staff are really worried about inconsiderate parking (this includes dropping off) and dangerous driving around St. Mary's...

A letter from the children of St. Mary's

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to you on behalf of all the children at St. Mary's. We are worried about the parking around our school. We feel that the way you park and complete 3-point turns outside our school is dangerous. Also, as the days are getting darker, you might not see us - that puts us in danger.

Over the years, the School Council have tried lots of things to try and stop you parking outside of school. We raised money and worked with the PTA to buy bollards which were destroyed by cars running over them. We asked Mrs Yorke to write to you in her newsletters about your parking and feel ignored because you continue to park where you like. We are now writing to you directly.

There are lots of other places you can park around school. Such as, Waitrose, St. Mary's road and Ethel Road. There is also parking at Grove Park, which you could use.

The areas surrounding school- Vivian Close and Waterward Close are private. Therefore, you CANNOT park there either. Please respect our neighbours.


Vivian Road needs to be kept clear so that we are safe.

What if an ambulance needed to get past or in to school?

The barrier is even sometimes blocked and it wouldn't be able to get to us...

We need you to make a change.

Parking on double yellow lines outside a school
is not permitted at any time,
unless you have a Blue Badge and park
for up to three hours.
If the school has yellow zig zag lines with signs,
you must follow the hours of operation.
Our school has signs that say no parking between 8am-4pm.

We know that so many of our parents park safely and share our concerns about parking around school. Many email school with photos that they have taken of illegal parking and ask what to do to help and to report dangerous dropping off, parking and driving...

#### This is what you can do to help it stop!!!



#### Report dangerous parking to the Police online

https://betterstreetsforbirmingham.org/op-snap/

#### Reportable driving offences include:

- close passes
- not stopping at a traffic light or pedestrian crossing
- dangerous driving
- using a mobile phone behind the wheel
- making a banned turn

You can also report obstructive parking. This include parking:

- on or next to zig zag markings
- over dropped kerbs with tactile paving
- in a place that forces a wheelchair user or double pram into the road

#### School will:

- continue to approach our parents if we deem their driving, stopping or parking dangerous to our children and community
- · take photos of any vehicles parked obstructively
- report any inconsiderate or illegal stopping, parking and driving

(please note stopping in the middle of the road and your children jumping out of the car is unsafe, inconsiderate and may be deemed illegal).

- work alongside parking officials, the council and the Police to improve the situation
- encourage parents to be vigilant and help us keep our school community safe


#### Please note:

Home school agreements are in place for all our families with children attending this school. This outlines that any behaviour deemed to be aggressive or unsafe may result in formal action from the Governors. This could include being banned from school activities and site. Our staff will challenge any behaviour and/or driving that is unsafe, inappropriate or aggressive. Please may we remind you that vehicles are not allowed on site at certain points of the day and to try to gain access at this time is not permitted; likewise blocking the school gates is not allowed at any time. These precautions are in place for the safety of the children, the staff and the community. We thank so many of our families who are always committed to safeguarding of the school premises and support the school ethos and rules.

- The Holy Spirit guides us in living like Jesus and loving others as God's family too.










<u>Year 1 Mass - 15.1.25</u> <u>-The Baptism of our Lord</u>




Y2 retold the story of the Flight into Egypt.




Y3 wrote diary entries as Shepherds retelling how the Angels appeared to



Y4 focused on how messages from the Angels changed the lives of characters from the Bible.






Y5 analysed artwork depicting the Wise Men and reflected on the faith of these men vs. the fear of Herod.
