Dear parents and carers,

Each week in school we have a weekly theme which is linked to our Prayer life. We introduce this weekly theme in our Monday whole-school Gospel assembly and the children learn more in their classes and prayer time as the week goes on. Our theme this week has been Education Sunday. We have been praying for all the staff that work in schools across the World and we remind ourselves that those called to work in schools are serving a vocation. Today Fr. Hilary blessed our classrooms, teachers and children. We pray that the Lord watches over our St. Mary's family throughout this Academic Year and that we live and breathe our school mission, living our lives according to God's will. With this in mind, the children of St. Mary's have also been campaigning to become leaders and class representatives. The elections for school council, spiritual council, CAFOD club, RRSA representative, play leaders, prefects and Head boy/girl have begun and decisions are beginning to be made.

For next week's theme, we are celebrating God's wonderful creation and looking a little more deeply at Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si - where he compels all of us to do our part to protect Our Common Home. As part of our creation learning, we are having a fun Super Science week in school, which is very exciting.

At the start of each Academic Year, I do like to remind all parents about car safety around the school grounds. Our school gates are closed between 8am and 5pm every day as this is the time when we have children on site. The children move between the school main building and the canteen, they are also being dismissed from after school clubs up till 4:45pm most evenings. No parents should be driving on site between these times. If you need to access school between the hours of 8am and 4:45pm, please use the pedestrian gate. Please park responsibly before school when dropping off your children and after school when picking up. We often have traffic wardens and police who wear cameras when walking up and down the street - they then use this to issue fines. Additionally, school staff (and parents) report any illegal parking to the Council and with photographic evidence, fines will be issued. To ensure that this does not happen to you, please park legally and walk your child the remainder of the way to the school gate.

At the start of the day, children should be dropped off at the blue gate. An SLT member is on duty for any messages and to ensure that your child safely enters the school building. We reduce adults coming on site at this time for the safety of all children. If your child is late, (after 8:45am), an adult must walk them to the school office and sign them in so that they receive their registration mark. At pick-up, please do not allow the children or younger siblings to run around the car park as there has been damage to cars in the past, as a result of this.

I thank you for your co-operation with parking and safeguarding procedures. We have 350 families accessing school site and managing the volume of traffic keeps everybody safe.

Finally, we are beginning our charity work next week with a big cake sale on Friday morning. We invite any parents to join the School Council and have a hot drink and cake. Any remaining cakes can be bought by the children. We are asking for donations of cakes to support this. Please can any cakes be donated on Wednesday and Thursday next week. We would like shop bought and home-made cakes. If you are donating a home-made cake, please leave a list of ingredients with it for reference.

We hope that you enjoy the weekend and I will see you all on Monday.








Our children are wonderful at leading prayer for the rest of their class. Throughout the school year, they will also lead prayer services for parents. Please look out for these! They are a joy to attend.

School Fund

Our School Fund is a vital source of income for our school.

It pays for the 'extras' such as Inspire workshops, curriculum resources, Christmas activities, theatre or performances as well as subsidising school trips.

These 'extras' are enjoyed by all year groups at St Mary's throughout the year.

Contribution to this fund is entirely voluntary and we are very grateful to those parents who regularly support the school in this way. However, in the last few years the amount of school fund received has dropped quite significantly. There are probably many reasons for this, but perhaps the most obvious is remembering to send in a donation every year, half term or term.

We understand that some families may find donating to us difficult, especially with the current cost of living crisis. With that in mind we have decided to alter the way our donations are done and hopefully make it easier to maintain.

Several parents make their contribution by standing order and we are very grateful to them all.

As we have been accepted as a charity for tax purposes, we can claim the tax on donations to school fund by parents who are taxpayers if those parents sign a Gift Aid Declaration.

This means that for every pound you give we get an extra 25p from the Inland Revenue, helping your donation to go further.

Consequently, by setting up a standing order for say, £2 per month per child or £5 per month per family for parents with multiple siblings who attend St Mary's, you will guarantee the school a monthly income on which we can reclaim tax.

Please consider this option seriously. If you feel unable to sign up to a monthly payment, why not pay a one-off payment of £20 per child per year or £50 per family per year, again with a Gift Aid declaration.

A Gift Aid declaration and standing order form has been emailed out to our families. If you wish to gift aid your donations then please complete and return these to school at your earliest convenience.
