
Year 5 learnt about inspirational Black women and made

Year 3 have been designing their own stone age houses.









Year 4 have been using their Maths and Science skills, converting units of time and drawing bar charts.


At this stage, the tour is for one parent per family - no children please.

### Reminders









After half-term, school will no longer be able to allow <u>large and bulky</u> ruck sacks in to the building. We are asking that all bags brought in by the children fit the pegs that children are assigned.

For health and safety reasons, your child will need to use their book bag and draw-string PE bag or similar sized bag (preferably blue in colour).

Any children still attending with large ruck sacks that are too bulky for the pegs, will be asked to leave their ruck sacks at the 'ruck sack' stop which is situated next to the lunch box stop. I am taking parent feedback on board, whilst still following the school prospectus and health and safety procedures.

### Jewellery



To **ensure the safety of all children**, we will <u>only</u> allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE.

On PE days we are asking that children do not wear any jewellery, so that it is not lost if they are asked to remove it for physical lessons. Thank you for supporting us with this, your child's safety is at the forefront of our uniform decisions.

### Y6 applications for Secondary Schools - apply before 31.10.2022

If you have a child currently in Year 6, please make sure that you have applied for their Secondary School.

If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at <a href="https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions">www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</a> <a href="https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions">between 1 September and 31 October 2021</a>.

It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2021. Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2021 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, and these applications will be processed after 1 March 2022, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.



### Coats

As the weather is changeable now, please ensure that your child comes to school with their waterproof coats.

### Labelling of clothing

There is a very high volume of unnamed jumpers, cardigans and coats now in the parent shelter.

Please label all belongings for your child (including lunch boxes / water bottles / clothing...)

Items that are labelled are returned to your child's classroom when they are left somewhere else in school. Items that are not labelled are placed in the parent shelter.

There are places where you can park safely around the school area - please be considerate and keep our children safe by choosing one of these options.




The yellow lines outside of school have a 'NO STOPPING' rule between the hours of 8-9 am and 3-4 pm.

- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PRC test), <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PRC test.
- If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.





- All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.
- From 16<sup>th</sup> August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.
